




### Last chance to register for SRC Mini: Myopia

CARN optometry information session for students

The Community and Research Network (CARN) will host an interactive online session aimed at students on the topic of optometry, next Monday. The CARN is a network of health professionals, health consumers, researchers and interested community members, seeking to share their expertise and experience to promote good health and wellbeing. During the session you'll hear from two PhD students from Deakin University who will talk about their research.

Tim Murphy will explain his research into diabetic retinopathy. He will discuss how building on the images generated from artificial intelligence research and using multiple image processing techniques, can better understand where damage occurs most often.

Jacqueline Kirkman will present her research on what factors influence optometry clinical placements success and satisfaction from the perspective of optometry students, and how this research may lead to improved development of placement programs not only for optometry students, but other health professions.

The session is aimed at students, but everyone in both Victoria and South Australia are welcome to attend. It will be held on Monday, 22 November, 12-1pm (AEDT). Book your place now.
