Why a dress code?



Peninsula Kingswood is a warm and welcoming Club that prides itself on being a leader of the industry. The standard of dress and general appearance will, at times, govern the privileges of all members and their guests who use the facilities of the Clubhouse and Courses.

These standards are consistent with the Club's vision and values. As such, the Club enforces a dress code that is aimed at maintaining the traditions of golf and club life. It is the member's responsibility to ensure they and their guests comply with these regulations.

Management and staff are instructed to advise members and guests if their dress is inappropriate.

With the above in mind, the next few pages should make it all much easier to understand what is acceptable and what is not.

Golf Course and Practice areas

Men

- Tailored slacks or shorts with predominantly white sports socks
- Tailored collared shirts designed for golf. Shirts must be tucked in
- Shoes designed for golf

Unacceptable Dress

- Denim, cargo pants, shorts or slacks with draw strings or elasticised waists
- Shirts and jumpers with dominant advertising logos or motifs other than manufacturers' insignia and club logos
- T-shirts
- Gym shoes, spiked shoes
- Caps worn in the reversed position





Golf Course and Practice areas

Women

- Tailored slacks, skirts and shorts
- Golf shirts may be worn not tucked in

Unacceptable Dress

Leggings worn without a skirt

Children

It is permissible for children of 15 years of age or younger, accompanying members in the clubhouse, to be dressed in a manner which may not fully conform to the dress standards providing the children are wearing clothing and footwear which is neat, clean and tidy and will not cause offence to other members.





Clubhouse

Correct golf and tennis attire may be worn in the clubhouse

Men are permitted to wear boat-style shoes without socks

Unacceptable Dress

- **Denim** (unless deemed acceptable for an event and after 5 pm on Friday during summer twilight programmes and Club events)
- Collarless shirts
- Shirts and jumpers with dominant advertising logos or motifs other than manufacturers' insignia and club logos
- Non-tailored slacks and shorts including cargo pants, board shorts and pants with draw strings or elasticised waists
- Tank tops, Hoodies, Ugg Boots
- Leggings worn alone without a skirt
- Hats or caps must be removed in the clubhouse
- Gym or pool attire
- Clothing and tattoos with offensive religious or political messages





Sports Centre

Gym pool and walking track attire

- Tracksuits, gym shorts, t-shirts, singlets, crop-tops, gym or sports shoes
- Members are encouraged to use the sports centre changing facility but may access the sports centre from the car park in pool or gym attire
- Gym or pool attire is not permitted on the outdoor kitchen or deck areas of the clubhouse
- Walking boots may be worn on the track, however, they are not to be worn in the clubhouse
- Accommodation house guests may access the sports centre via the clubhouse, bar and locker rooms attired in a tracksuit or robe

TENNIS

- Tennis attire including collared shirt
- Tennis players may access the bar and deck areas

BOWLS

Bowls attire predominately white with flat shoes.
